A reading from the letter to the Hebrews

(1.1-4)

Long ago God spoke to our ancestors in many and various ways by the prophets, but in these last days he has spoken to us by a Son, whom he appointed heir of all things, through whom he also created the worlds. He is the reflection of God's glory and the exact imprint of God's very being, and he sustains all things by his powerful word. When he had made purification for sins, he sat down at the right hand of the Majesty on high, having become as much superior to angels as the name he has inherited is more excellent than theirs.

The Gospel Acclamation:

The Word became flesh and dwelt among us and we have seen his glory.

Listen to the Gospel of Christ according to S. John Glory to you, O Lord.

(1. 1-14)

In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God. He was in the beginning with God. All things came into being through him, and without him not one thing came into being. What has come into being in him was life, and the life was the light of all people. The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness did not overcome it. There was a man sent from God, whose name was John. He came as a witness to testify to the light, so that all might believe through him. He himself was not the light, but he came to testify to the light. The true light, which enlightens everyone, was coming into the world. He was in the world, and the world came into being through him; yet the world did not know him. He came to what was his own, and his own people did not accept him. But to all who received him, who believed in his name, he gave power to become children of God, who were born, not of blood or of the will of the flesh or of the will of man, but of God. And the Word became flesh and lived among us, and we have seen his glory, the glory as of a father's only son, full of grace and truth.

This is the Gospel of the Lord.

Meditation: The birth of Jesus brings hope for a better future to the whole world. The good news we celebrate today, the promise of Christmas is that in Jesus, in this tiny child born in Bethlehem. God reaches out to us in love. He came to share our lives and invites us to share his glorious eternal life. He promises a place with him in heaven for ever for all who respond to his loving us by loving him and our neighbours in return. In revealing the love of God for us, Jesus shows that like any good parent our heavenly Father wants the best for us his children. In Jesus God invests himself in us. He wants us to discover the talents he has given us, to develop and use those talents for the greater good of the communities in which we live and for the whole world. He wants us to reach our full potential as the human beings he created us to be. He wants all this for us because he wants us to enjoy our lives to the full. We can hope to do this if we walk with Jesus in our daily lives as he walks with us. Today as we share the hope of a better future free from the fear and danger of conflict and warfare let us invest all our hopes for the future in him, Jesus, the Son of God. As we gaze upon the image of the new-born Christ child surrounded by his parents and the visiting shepherds, let us feel the excitement of the arrival of a new-born and let the hope that a new child brings grow in our hearts. As he was born in a stable in Bethlehem two thousand plus years ago, let him be born again in our hearts today let his love shine through us that the hope which his birth brings can be renewed through all the world. Amen.

Intercessions:

In the power of the Holy Spirit and in union with Christ let us bring our prayers for the Church and for the world to our heavenly Father.

We pray for the Church throughout the world, for the leaders of the Church among them Mary our Bishop. We pray for the people of the world, for the victims of violence and oppression, for all suffering the effects of natural disaster and for those suffering from famine or drought; May there be peace throughout the world, may reconciliation overcome conflict and division.

We pray for our own community, for our families, friends and neighbours. We give thanks for all who serve the needs of the vulnerable; May the joy of Christmas fill our hearts, may the blessing of Christ fill us all.

Lord in your mercy, hear our prayer.

We pray for all who are in need, for those who are sick, for those who are bereaved, for the lonely and isolated and for all in any kind of need. We hold in our hearts before God those known to us who are in need at this time and all whose names are recorded in our intercession books; may they be strengthened by the Holy Spirit and consoled with the love of Christ.

Lord in your mercy, hear our prayer.

We pray for all who have died. We remember before God our own departed loved ones and we pray for the recently departed and those whose anniversary of death falls at this time. May they share the eternal glory of heaven in the company of all the saints.

Lord in your mercy, hear our prayer.

We bring all our prayers to our heavenly Father as we pray together:
