Collect: Almighty and everlasting God, you have given us your servants grace, by the confession of a true faith, to acknowledge the glory of the eternal Trinity and in the power of the divine majesty to worship the Unity: keep us steadfast in this faith, that we may evermore be defended from all adversities; through Jesus Christ your Son our Lord, who is alive and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever. **Amen.**

A reading from the book of the Prophet Isaiah **40. 12-17, 27-31**
Who has measured the waters in the hollow of his hand and marked off the heavens with a span, enclosed the dust of the earth in a measure, and weighed the mountains in scales and the hills in a balance? Who has directed the spirit of the Lord, or as his counsellor has instructed him? Whom did he consult for his enlightenment, and who taught him the path of justice? Who taught him knowledge, and showed him the way of understanding? Even the nations are like a drop from a bucket, and are accounted as dust on the scales; see, he takes up the isles like fine dust. Lebanon would not provide fuel enough, nor are its animals enough for a burnt-offering. All the nations are as nothing before him; they are accounted by him as less than nothing and emptiness. Why do you say, O Jacob, and speak, O Israel, 'My way is hidden from

the Lord, and my right is disregarded by my God'? Have you not known? Have you not heard? The Lord is the everlasting God, the Creator of the ends of the earth. He does not faint or grow weary; his understanding is unsearchable. He gives power to the faint, and strengthens the powerless. Even youths will faint and be weary, and the young will fall exhausted; but those who wait for the Lord shall renew their strength, they shall mount up with wings like eagles, they shall run and not be weary, they shall walk and not faint.

Glory to you, O Lord.

Now the eleven disciples went to Galilee, to the mountain to which Jesus had directed them. When they saw him, they worshipped him; but some doubted. And Jesus came and said to them, 'All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me. Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, and teaching them to obey everything that I have commanded you. And remember, I am with you always, to the end of the age.'

Meditation: Today we praise God in celebration of the life of the most Holy and glorious Trinity! The divine communion of three persons, Father, Son and Holy Spirit, so perfectly united in love and purpose that they cannot be divided in any way – three persons, one God. God the Father, the creator of all things, God the Son who speaks the word of God revealing his love to us, who lived among us and who on the cross reconciled us to God and made it possible for us to share a new life with God and God the Holy Spirit who lives in our hearts and leads us on our earthly pilgrimage to our eternal home with God in heaven. It is in sharing the life of the Holy Trinity, the life of God, that we live and have our being. In our own daily lives as individuals and as a community of God's people we are all called to mirror and reflect the life of God, the life of the Holy Trinity to the wider community and the world. We are called to love one another as God loves us, to be united in purpose to bring the love and peace of God to a world in desperate need. At home many are suffering the effects of the continual rises in the cost of living which is bringing real hardship to many families. Throughout the world in addition to the economic crisis we continue to witness violence and oppression with horrific scenes from the continuing conflicts in the Ukraine, the Sudan, the Holy Land and throughout the Middle East and Gulf. Through it all we see that the forces for good are strongest when humanity is united in love in the face of evil and of all that threatens our peace and sense of security. Communities at home continue to work together to support one another in myriad of ways including foodbanks showing a real love of neighbour and abroad we see nations standing together in the face of aggression or disaster. As we celebrate the perfect unity of the

Holy Trinity, the perfect communion of love which is God, as we give thanks that God has called us to live as members of his family, the Communion of Saints, we give thanks that he shares his life with us. We pray that we may continue to face the challenges which present themselves both to us more immediately and to humanity more generally united in love with one another and determined that God's will for us and for his world will prevail. As we ponder the mystery of the Holy Trinity, three persons yet one God may we see a reflection of the life of the Trinity in the Church and in all humanity, many nations, yet one body of humanity, one human family the world over gloriously diverse, yet strongest when united in love and peace. Amen.

In the power of the Holy Spirit and in union with Christ let us bring our prayers for the Church and for the world to our heavenly Father.

We pray for the Church throughout the world, for the leaders of the Church among them Mary our Bishop. We pray for the clergy and people of our diocese and for our own ministry area; may the Church shine as a beacon of light and hope throughout the word reflecting the perfect unity of the Holy Trinity.

Lord in your mercy, **hear our prayer.**

We pray for the people of the world, for the victims of violence and oppression among them the people of the Ukraine, the Sudan, the Holy Land and for all throughout the Middle East and Gulf region, for all suffering the effects of natural disaster and for those suffering from famine or drought; May humanity discover a new unity bringing the hope of peace and justice for all people.

Lord in your mercy, **hear our prayer.**

We pray for our own community, for our families, friends and neighbours. We give thanks for all who serve the needs of the vulnerable; may we in our lives and relationships reflect the love and the unity of the Most Holy and Glorious Trinity.

We pray for all who are in need, for those who are sick, for those who are bereaved, for the lonely and isolated and for all in any kind of need. We hold in our hearts before God those known to us who are in need at this time and all whose names are recorded in our intercession books; relieve them according to their need, strengthen them with your Holy Spirit and console them with the love of Christ.

Lord in your mercy, **hear our prayer.**

We pray for all who have died. We remember before God our own departed loved ones and we pray for the recently departed and those whose anniversary of death falls at this time; welcome them and all the departed into the eternal joy and peace of your heavenly kingdom.
