### **Listen to the Gospel of Christ according to St. Matthew.**

**22. 1-14**

#### **Glory to you, O Lord.**

Once more Jesus spoke to them in parables, saying: 'The kingdom of heaven may be compared to a king who gave a wedding banquet for his son. He sent his slaves to call those who had been invited to the wedding banquet, but they would not come. Again he sent other slaves, saying, "Tell those who have been invited: Look, I have prepared my dinner, my oxen and my fat calves have been slaughtered, and everything is ready; come to the wedding banquet." But they made light of it and went away, one to his farm, another to his business, while the rest seized his slaves, maltreated them, and killed them. The king was enraged. He sent his troops, destroyed those murderers, and burned their city. Then he said to his slaves, "The wedding is ready, but those invited were not worthy. Go therefore into the main streets, and invite everyone you find to the wedding banquet." Those slaves went out into the streets and gathered all whom they found, both good and bad; so the wedding hall was filled with guests. 'But when the king came in to see the guests, he noticed a man there who was not wearing a wedding robe, and he said to him, "Friend, how did you get in here without a wedding robe?" And he was speechless. Then the king said to the attendants, "Bind him hand and foot, and throw him into the outer darkness, where there will be weeping and gnashing of teeth.'" For many are called, but few are chosen.'

### **Meditation:**

I am sure many of us have either been invited to a party or get together or invited people to an event that we have planned. We hope that if people are unable to attend, they inform the host so that he/she knows who is able and who is unable to attend. As we know, not all events run smoothly and people, without any advance warning, simply do not turn up or make an excuse not to attend and then at the other end of the spectrum there is the gate crasher who turns up without an invite!!! In today's Gospel reading, we see Jesus, using a parable, too speak of the Kingdom of God as a party. Some people who were invited did not attend, others did not take it seriously and made excuses to do their thing and finally there were those who appear to be insulted at having received an invite that they assaulted those who came to fetch them. There must have been something about this party that made people feel as if they did not want to go. There are many occasions in the Bible where Jesus uses the image of a welcoming feast to represent the Kingdom of God. In this parable we notice how Jesus emphasis God's anger at being rejected through the host in the parable being annoyed with those who did not come and the man who wore was not wearing wedding robes was thrown out. So what can we learn from this parable. Jesus is teaching us not to be complacent. God will offer us a place in his kingdom and as Isaiah said in the Old Testament reading, God will fulfil our needs, wipe away our tears, and remove our guilt and shame. God invites each of us to his banquet but not just to take our seat. He wants us to prepare it with him and to begin the work of building his kingdom in both our lives and the world. When we think of the man who was thrown out of the feast, St Augustine suggests that it may be that the garment which he lacks is love. The wedding garment is a symbol – that to enter the kingdom of God we need to have a change of heart and say sorry for all our wrongdoings. This repentance is not to be a five minute wonder but to be continuous throughout our lives of love and compassion. Many of us have heard the words, God is love and sometimes there is a chance that we may use the words as an excuse for not living out those words and bringing God's love to the people we meet each and every day – either in work, the community or in our leisure time. If we have occasions when we behave in this manner then we can be likened to the man without the wedding garment. As individuals, we are each given the opportunity to make our own choices in our lives with some choices having consequences. This parable teaches us that how we respond to God's invitation is so important – as people of faith and people of the party let us make sure we do our best to make the invitation clear. Amen.

### **Intercessions:**

In the power of the Holy Spirit and in union with Christ let us bring our prayers for the Church and for the world to our heavenly Father.

We pray for the Church throughout the world, for the leaders of the Church among them Andrew our Archbishop and Mary our Bishop. We pray for the clergy and people of our diocese and for our own ministry area; that the Church may faithfully work with Christ to proclaim the saving love of God to the world.

We pray for our own community, for our families, friends and neighbours. We give thanks for all who serve the needs of the vulnerable; may we persevere in the ways of Christ bringing hope and peace to those in need around us.

We pray for all who are in need, for those who are sick, for those who are bereaved, for the lonely and isolated and for all in any kind of need. We hold in our hearts before God those known to us who are in need at this time and all whose names are recorded in our intercession books; relieve them according to their need, strengthen them with your Holy Spirit and console them with the love of Christ.

Lord in your mercy, **hear our prayer.**

We pray for all who have died. We remember before God our own departed loved ones and we pray for the recently departed and those whose anniversary of death falls at this time; welcome them and all the departed into the eternal joy and peace of your heavenly kingdom.

We bring all our prayers to our heavenly Father as we pray together:
